

Chairman's Introduction

Welcome to the latest summer newsletter. It's now a year since the updated Sutton Neighbourhood Plan was adopted following a referendum with over 86% of people voting in favour. This new plan builds on the previous one, adding a Design Code, Housing Needs Assessment plus new and revised policies for example to better address biodiversity and climate change.

We have already seen the benefits of a Neighbourhood Plan when the planning application from Vistry (Linden Homes) for new homes to the north of the village was determined and they agreed to provide additional playing fields, land for a new burial ground and money to refurbish the MUGA (multi-use games area). With work on their new development just about to get underway the parish council will be working on plans for those community facilities and is keen to hear from residents who want to get involved.

The parish council is made up of people who live or work in Sutton and volunteer a few hours a month to attend council meetings and working parties. Those working parties develop proposals to improve and enhance the village. They cover a range of different topics including traffic and transport, sports and recreation, youth activities and facilities, establishing a library access point and the taking action on climate change. If you are 18 years or older and can spare a few hours then why not get involved, just get in touch with the parish clerk by email office@sutton-cambs-pc.gov.uk.

A major focus of the Traffic and Transport working party continues to be to try get agreement from the County Council to introduce a weight limit restriction on the 81381 through the village to stop HGVs using the road as a short cut to and from the A14. Lorries should be using the major roads away from the village unless they are making local deliveries. Another initiative is the opening of the footpath between St Andrews Close and The Orchards. This will provide a safe route away from The Brook for those living in the north east of the village to reach the primary school, play area and playing fields. Work is due to begin shortly.

One of the initiatives from the Sports & Recreation working party has seen the recent installation of the Monkey Challenge Climbing Wall on the playing fields, made possible with grant funding. The Climate Change working party is working on the installation of EV charging points in The Glebe car park for use both by local residents and visitors.

Parish Council meetings are usually held on the fourth Tuesday of the month in The Pavilion (next to the playing fields) starting at 7.30pm. Everyone is welcome to attend and there is time at the start of the meeting for public questions and comments.

Owns and Maintains

- Ø Burial ground and Garden of Remembrance.
- Ø Street furniture in the village i.e. benches, bus stops and noticeboards.
- Ø Football fields and multi-use games area.
- Ø Stirling Way Play Park and open spaces.
- Ø The Pavilion, The Glebe, Community Room and Brookland Centre which we hire out.
- Ø Leases out the field allotments at Chain Causeway.
- Ø Hold 12 parish council meetings per year as well as other meetings, for example Committee and Working Party Meetings, The Annual Meeting of Electorate, Annual Meeting of Parish Council and the Budget & Precept Meeting: all information can be found on our website/noticeboard.
- Ø Cut the grass verges on behalf of Cambridge County Council.
- Ø Work with Cambridge County Council to enable access to footpaths, byways and bridle ways.
- Ø Support local organistations with financial grants, we are pleased to have helped the Cricket Club, Brownies and many more.
- Ø Act as consultee on planning applications
- Where possible assist residents with queries
- O Look at new schemes and projects that can help the community.
- Ø Local Highway Improvement Schemes








Climbing Wall The Monkey Challenge Climbing Frame was installed in June after applying for a specific grant funding to add more facilities for children in the area.
